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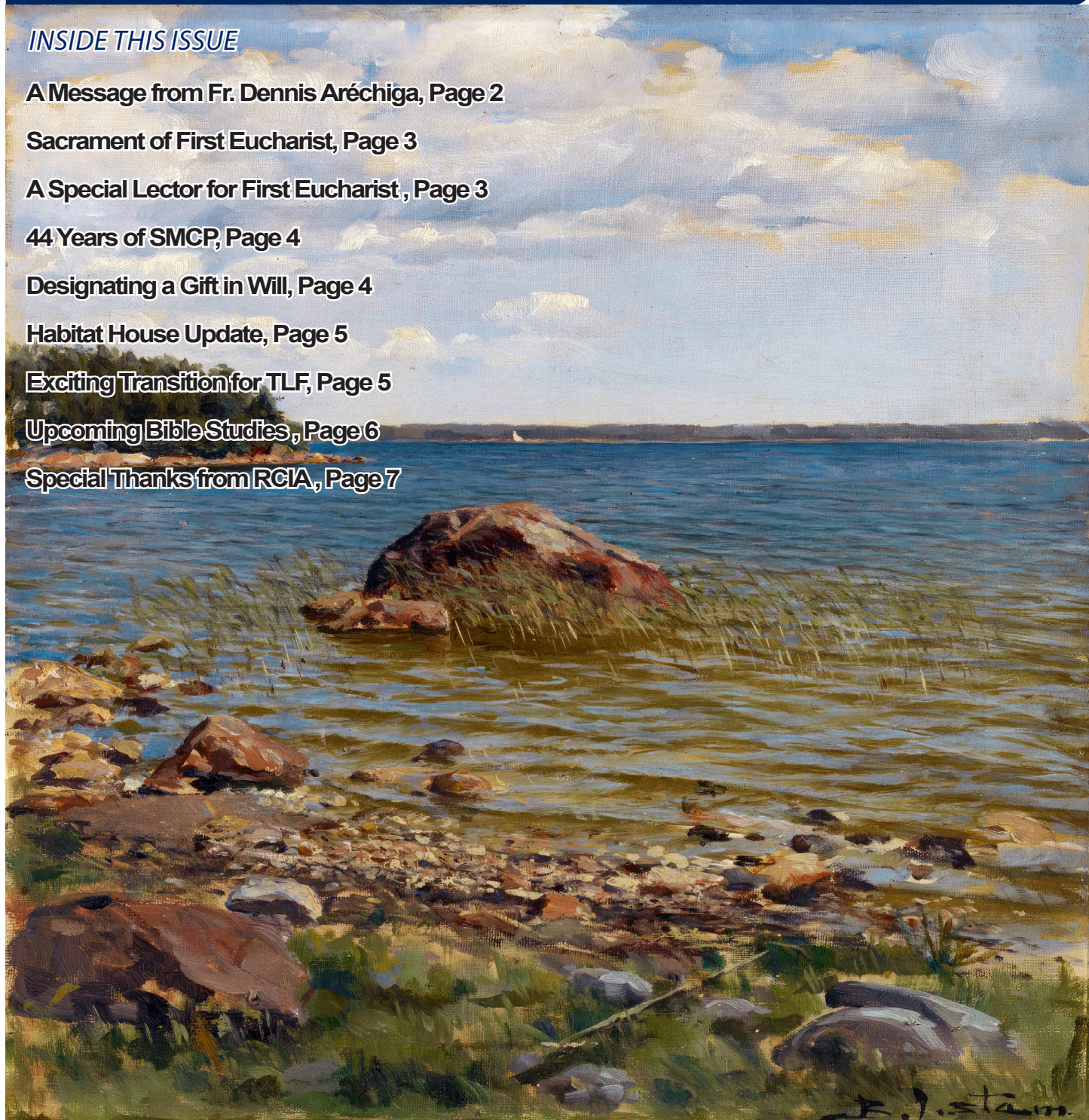
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A Message from Fr. Dennis Aréchiga



“I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.”

The Gospel of John 14:6

Something momentous happened this past May 2nd: the Camino San Antonio was born. A project under the “On the Way, Andale” Campaign Drive, a Visitor and Information Center sits on the old grounds of what was the first seminary in our diocese, St. John’s Seminary. It is located next to Mission Concepción just south of downtown San Antonio on Mission Road. This visitor center staff can create a customized option for pilgrims to visit the missions by foot, bicycle or car. Those who log miles can also document them in a booklet that the Camino of Santiago de Compostelo in Spain recognizes for its pilgrimages. The gospel verse above reminds us that we are called to be pilgrims who journey towards Christ who grants us the fullness of truth and a richness of life.

When a relic of St. James was discovered in Compostelo, pilgrims began flocking there as early as the 9th century. Some begin as far away as France. While the goal is to visit the church of St. James, another important aspect of a pilgrimage is the journey itself: making connections with other pilgrims from all over the world who are united in their pursuit of a deeper faith and relationship with God.

On page 595, The Catholic Dictionary states that the word pilgrimage comes from the Latin peregrinus which means “foreigner” and is “One who travels to a holy place to obtain some spiritual benefit, and the trip itself; the purpose of the pilgrimage may be to venerate a sacred object or religious relic, to be in the presence of a holy person, to do penance, or to offer thanksgiving in return for graces received (cf. Jgs. 21:2, 1 Sm. 1:3). The Ark of the Covenant was taken on pilgrimage to Jerusalem by David and his men (2 Sm. 6-7)”

Summer is a time with kids being out of school and when schedules may be more relaxed that lends itself to visiting a holy site. If one cannot travel to Spain, Rome or Jerusalem, there are many other interesting local sites apart from our local missions that are worth visiting. On Zarzamora Street on the near West side, the Church of the Little Flower is the National Basilica for St. Therese of Lisieux. The Oblate School of Theology hosts an outdoor replica of the Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto that is a peaceful oasis within the business of the city that lends itself to prayer and meditation; there is also an inside chapel attached to it along with a gift shop next door. Some of the beautiful chapels in our Catholic Universities such as Assumption Chapel at St. Mary’s University (1909) under the direction of the Marianist Order, the Motherhouse Chapel of the Sisters of the Incarnate Word (1907) and the Sisters of Divine Providence Sacred Heart Conventual Chapel (1921) on the campus of Our Lady of the Lake University are all worthwhile to see, pray in and experience. May we take the time to visit holy places of worship as we seek to follow Christ who is our way, truth and life.

When time came to receive the sacrament, Father asked the congregation to wait and allow the children to receive the Eucharist first. It was clearly a very important event in the life of the children and their families who attended as witnesses to this special time.

Our prayer for these young people this important event marks the beginning of their regular participation in the central act of their Catholic worship and their deeper connection to the body and blood of Christ. Designating a Gift in Will

Making a gift from your will involves including specific instructions in your will that dictate how your assets should be distributed after your death. These are the steps you can follow to make a gift from your will:

- Determine what assets you want to gift. Think about what assets you want to leave behind as gifts. This could include money, real property, or other valuable possessions.
- Choose the recipient(s) of your gift. This could be a family member, friend or a charitable organization like St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church.
- Ensure your gift is legally valid by working with an attorney to draft or update your will. Your attorney can help you ensure that your gift is structured in a way that fully meets your intentions and complies with Texas state law.

- Include specific instructions regarding the gift. These instructions may include identifying the assets being gifted and outlining how they should be distributed.
- Once you have included your gift preferences in your will, sign and execute the will according to Texas state law. Review and update your will periodically to ensure that your wishes are up to date and accurately reflect your wishes.

This May TLF began an exciting transition to provide the same services, but at a new venue in Towne Twin Village, a development providing permanent shelter and community for the chronically homeless.

During this first phase of transition, TLF will continue delivering sandwiches to Catholic Worker House with plans to move these services when CWH's new facility in Towne Twin Village is complete.

Lunches and evening meals are now being served at the newly completed pavilion at Towne Twin Village.

LaVerne Dysart, Chairman of the TLF Board, shared her enthusiasm about the transition noting, "On the streets, TLF volunteers served food, but the greater significance of their service was showing their guests dignity all God's children deserve - seeing Christ in them... all the above will still apply at Towne Twin Village, but our volunteers will additionally be tasked with being ambassadors; We will show by our actions and words that those we serve are valued members of this new community."

The TLF Board is confident with a positive approach and prayer, the ministry will successfully work through this large scope transition to better serve those in need, our family of volunteers at St. Mark and our community of San Antonio. Travel-

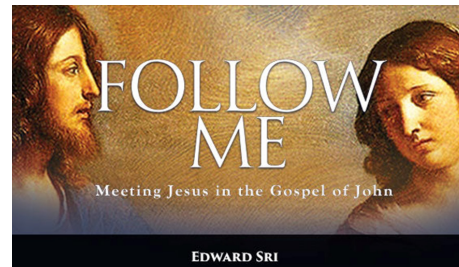
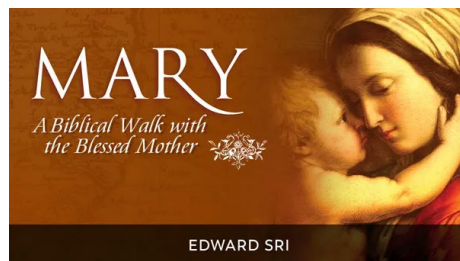
