

# A Message from Fr. Dennis Aréchiga



May we not overlook the importance of giving thanks to God.

"As he was entering a village, ten persons with leprosy met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" And when he saw them, he said, "Go show yourselves to the priests."

As they were going they were cleansed.

And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan."

This passage, taken from the Gospel of Luke 17:11-19 and the Mass offered on Thanksgiving, reminds us that although 10 lepers were cleansed, only one, a non-Jew and a Samaritan foreigner at that, returned to the Lord to offer thanks. The lepers who were healed received such a powerful gift – not only having their health restored but being able to rejoin society, find gainful employment and reintegrate themselves into society. That not all or most of them came back to offer thanks seems shocking to our sensibilities.

We have so much to be grateful for: the gift of our life, our faith, of living in a country in which we can enjoy the fruits of liberty and peace, especially when the world around us is in such turmoil and conflict. Thanksgiving is a time to pause, to reflect upon and count our many blessings. This gospel passage warns us to not be like those who are too busy to take the time to offer thanks to the one who makes all of our blessings possible, God, our maker.

I know that I am grateful for the gift of my family, you, my church family, and for the way God seems to provide even when energy levels are low and time seems in short supply; somehow, it all works out! November is also a time in which we celebrate the great feasts of All Saints and All Souls Day. It is a time when we remember the loved ones who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith. We too are grateful for their love and sacrifices, their kindness and guidance, that still impact us today. May we never forget them; may we be grateful for the imprint they have left on our hearts.

I pray you have a blessed Thanksgiving; I also give thanks for your presence as a faithful parishioner of St. Mark's Parish, and I leave you with a passage from the First Reading for the Thanksgiving Day Mass from Sirach 50:22-24:

"Bless the God of all,
who has done wondrous things on earth;
who fosters people's growth from their mother's womb,
and fashions them according to his will!
May he grant you joy of heart and
may peace abide among you."



## **ACTS** is Back

Hello, my name is Brooke Byers, I am 23 and have been a parishioner at St. Mark for 23 years. I consider myself incredibly fortunate to be able to say that my faith has been fully formed by this spectacular parish, the amazing people that make it feel like home, and the wonderful opportunities it has provided me with over the years that have grown and nourished my relationship with Christ.

One of those aforementioned wonderful opportunities St. Mark offers that I hold very near and dear to my heart is the ACTS retreat. There are a few different types of ACTS retreats that we offer here, each led by fellow parishioners. Men's and Women's retreats offered in both English and Spanish, Men and Women in Recovery, as well as Men and Women in Prison, and a Teen ACTS retreat for high schoolers.

I first witnessed the effects of these powerful retreats in seeing my parents' faiths being changed and their community expand as they attended - and then served on - their first retreats when I was growing up. Thanks to the youth program and the adaptation of the ACTS retreat to suit a younger demographic, I did not have to wait too long for it to be my turn to experience it for myself. I attended my first Teen ACTS retreat in 2015, served on team the following two summers and directed in 2018. I even came back to serve on team as a young adult once I started college. I don't think I could ever get sick of

being even a small part of these transformative weekends.

Although I always enjoy serving on team for Teen ACTS, I was entering into my 20's and starting to desire a deeper, more mature version of this experience that had given me so much. But when COVID happened, ACTS at St. Mark stopped for a few years. I am thrilled to say that as of this year, we are back in business and I was able to attend the Women's ACTS retreat in September! This experience was everything I needed.

The ACTS retreat has a truly special way of meeting you where you are at so you can get something out of it, no matter what stage of life you're in, and no matter what you're going through. I can't imagine there are many better ways to join a community that is loving and accepting and rooted in Christ while simultaneously strengthening your relationship with Him.

So far this year, we have had Men's Spanish and English ACTS retreats, Men in recovery, Women's English, and Teens.

If this sounds like something that you need in your life, I strongly encourage you to join us for an ACTS retreat that would suit your needs.

Our parish again committed to participate in the annual Fall '40 Days for Life' campaign and had a very successful 'sponsored day to pray' on October 14th. Parishioners and other friends covered the sidewalk in front of Planned Parenthood each hour of the day praying for the unborn.

Matt Troy, who participated, shared a few of his encounters. He noted one couple planning to vol-



unteer ran into car trouble, but that did not stop them. They caught an Uber and arrived to pray. Matt also encountered a woman stumbling upon their group and said," I don't know why I went this way. I think God sent me. When I saw you all standing outside with your signs, I knew I had to join you. I don't have a sign, but I will stand with you." He shared with her they had a sign she could use. Another woman from Padre Pio said she went to St. Marks for Mass the weekend before because she was running late for Padre Pios Mass. When she saw the sign up for our sponsored day to pray, she felt led to sign up from 12:00 to 1:00PM. She arrived early, which was great because Matt was by himself for about 20 minutes. Others also came to pray who did not initially sign up, such as a few Eucharistic Ministers from our Parish.

It was a great, successful day, and played an impactful part in the '40 Days for Life' community awareness campaign.





## Interested in the Bible?

About 15 years ago, I decided I wanted to know more about the Bible. I signed up for a Bible Study at St. Marthas In Kingwood, Texas. They were studying Exodus and found I was learning and making wonderful friends. The next year St. Martha's took up a study of the Gospel of John. I was hooked by this time on Bible Study, so the next year when I moved to San Antonio İ signed up for Bible Study at St. Marks. I did not know anybody at the parish, so I was a little apprehensive. About a week later, I got a call from Marvin Borowski informing me I was going to be in his small group and we were going to study the Bible Timeline by Jeff Cavins and Ascension Press. I have been in Bible Study ever since.

In case you have never done a Bible Study, let me explain how it works. You are given a study guide that has lessons in it and questions for you to answer. At St. Marks we meet on Tuesdays. We have two groups; one group meets in the morning and one in the evening. Both meet in The Guadalupe Room on the West Campus. Each sessions starts with a video about the lesson, then we break up into small groups and discuss our questions.

Now you know the mechanics of Bible Study. This year we are half way through the study of the book of Hebrews. We will finish at the end of October, and in January we will start the Study of Mary, A Biblical Walk with the Blessed Mother, by Edward Sri. Here is a quote about the study from page 1 of the study:

Mary: A Biblical Walk with the


Blessed Mother is a powerful Bible study that reveals Mary's unique role in God's kingdom and in our lives. You will experience the gospel through the eyes of Mary and get a vivid glimpse into her daily life. Seeing her in this way will lead you to a deeper relationship with the Blessed Mother and her son, Jesus.

The study of Mary is divided into 8 sessions.

Session 1. Introduction
Session 2. The Annunciation
Session 3. The Visitation
Session 4. The Nativity
Session 5. The Presentation and
The Finding of Jesus in the Temple
Session 6. The Wedding at Cana
Session 7. Mary at the Cross
Session 8. Mary Crowned with
Glory


